
PICK A SIDE CHARTING CONTRASTS IN SCRIPTURE

Charting Contrasts combines two Bible Interaction Tools. The first tool is a *journal or a study notebook*. Research shows that words written on a page register in our minds and memory differently than words typed on a page. When you write, you not only slow down, but you are interacting with Scripture, not just zipping through it.

The next tool is the *contrast chart* itself. In my example on Episode 71 of the More Than a Song podcast I used Josh Wilson's song, "That Was Then This is Now" to lead me to Ephesians 4 where I charted how Paul contrasts what we were like before Christ and how our lives should be IN Christ. By separating the characteristics into columns, you can see on the page the extreme differences between where we came from and where we should be. Hint: You want to see yourself in the right hand column!
