## **PSALM 22 AND THE CRUCIFIXION**

Psalm 22 clearly points to the crucifixion of Christ. This psalm begins with a passionate expression of grief and sorrow, just like the last hours of Christ that we meditate on in Episode 57 of "More Than a Song." The psalm, however, ends in words of victory and praise as it declares what should resonate in our hearts, "HE HAS DONE IT!" Use this as a tool to study God's Word as it relates to this psalm and the crucifixion.

Psalm 22:1-2 My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from saving me, from the words of my groaning? O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer, and by night, but I find no rest. From you comes my praise in the great congregation; my vows I will perform before those who fear him. The afflicted shall eat and be satisfied; those who seek him shall praise the Lord! May your hearts live forever! All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the Lord, and all the families of the nations shall worship before you. For kingship belongs to the Lord, and he rules over the nations. All the prosperous of the earth eat and worship; before him shall bow all who go down to the dust, even the one who could not keep himself alive. Posterity shall serve him; it shall be told of the Lord to the coming generation; they shall come and proclaim his righteousness to a people yet unborn, that he has done it.
